CONDUCTORS



Young Keun Kim received Bachelor of Music degree (B.M.) and the Master of Music Education degree (M.M.Ed.) from Georgia State University. For the past twenty two years, he has taught and directed orchestras at the elementary, middle, and high school levels. For the past twenty two years, his groups have earned consecutive SUPERIOR ratings at the GMEA District V Orchestra Large-Group Performance Evaluation. His groups have been invited to perform at the prestigious Midwest Clinic-An International Band and Orchestra Conference in Chicago; the 58th Biennial Music Educators National Conference in Nashville, Tennessee; and have three times performed at the Georgia Music Educators Association In-Service Conference in Savannah, Georgia. Young Kim's groups have also traveled and performed internationally, participating in three European concert tours. The performances include cities of Austria (Salzburg, Vienna, Eisenstadt), Germany (Munich), Italy (Rome, Perugia, Florence, Assisi, Cremona, Venice), Hungary (Budapest), and Czech Republic (Prague). His orchestras have performed numerous times at the

Symphony Hall and at the Georgia Governor's Mansion.

Young Kim has also been active in the Korean-American community in the Atlanta area. He has founded the Korean-American Youth Center Orchestra/KAYCO (청소년센터 오케스트라) including the performance at the Woodruff Park during the 1996 Atlanta Summer Olympic Games. Young Kim has also directed the Korean-American Chamber Orchestra. The members included principal string players of the Atlanta Symphony Youth Orchestra (ASYO) and college students of Georgia State University.

Young Kim is an active clinician, guest conductor, and adjudicator throughout Georgia and Southeast. He has served as the GMEA District V Orchestra Chair, District V Orchestra Large Group Performance Evaluation (LGPE), and the Fulton County High School Honor Orchestra Organizing Chair. Young Kim has also served as the National High School Honor Orchestra (NHSHO) Representative/Chair for Georgia.

His current professional affiliation includes Music Educators National Conference (MENC), Georgia Music Educators Association (GMEA), National School Orchestra Association with American String Teachers Association (NSOA/ASTA), and Kappa Delta Pi, an International Honor Society in Education. Young Kim is listed in the 2006-2007 editions of National Register's Who's Who in Executives and Professionals.

He has been a member of the prestigious Georgia Governor's Honors Program (GHP) faculty for four summers (1998, 1999, 2000, and 2003). In addition to guest conducting orchestras throughout Georgia and southeast, he has also conducted many summer music camps such as the American String Teachers Association (ASTA) Music Camp and the University of Georgia Summer Music Camp in Athens, Georgia.

Young Kim is listed in the 1998, 1999, 2003, 2005, 2006 editions of the "Who's Who Among America's Teachers." In 2006, he was selected as the "2006 Georgia Music Educator of the Year" by the Georgia Music Educators Association. He was also selected and recognized as the "Expert Teacher Cadre-7" in the Fulton County Schools system in 1997 and participated in its leadership program. Young Kim was named the S.T.A.R. Teacher of Johns Creek High School in 2010.



Joseph M. Kirschner Retired, Former Supervisor of Music Fulton County Schools

After serving as band and orchestra director in the school systems of Bledsoe County, Tennessee, and Atlanta, Georgia, Mr. Kirschner was appointed to the music administration staff of the Fulton County Schools in Georgia, where he remained until his retirement as Coordinator of Music Education. During this time he also served tenures as violinist with the Chattanooga and Atlanta Symphony Orchestras. For a ten year period, Mr. Kirschner was a Conductor and Director of the Atlanta Community Symphony Orchestra. He has toured extensively as a violinist with both popular and classical music performing organizations. He has served as an adjunct music education instructor for Georgia State University.

Mr. Kirschner believes that teachers must be able to do what they teach; and so to this day, he has continued to work professionally in all areas of music performance and school

music administration. He is a past president of the Georgia Music Educators Association and the Georgia (Zeta) Chapter of Phi Beta Mu, the national honorary bandmasters' fraternity. He also served as a member of the national board of directors of the American String Teachers Association. He has served as a conductor of all-state bands and orchestras and as director/adjudicator at regional festivals, contests, and auditions throughout the southeastern and central United States. He is especially proud to have served as a district band/orchestra director/festival adjudicator in every district of the state of Georgia. He has served as a workshop presenter for the College Board and has conducted many specialized workshops and clinic events in brass and string instrument pedagogy and instrumental music education for students and teachers for school systems, universities, and professional music education associations, including the Festival Adjudication Workshop of the Georgia Music Educators Association. In 1999, Mr. Kirschner chaired the organizing and development committee for the Georgia Music Educators Association College Scholarship Program.

Mr. Kirschner is the recipient of many awards and distinctions, including the *Distinguished Alumnus*, the School of Music of the University of Georgia Award, the Distinguished Career Award of the Georgia Music Educators Association, and certificates of appreciation and outstanding service, presented by the Georgia Chapter and the National Board of Directors of the American String Teachers Association.



Tim Anderson is enjoying his 7th year as the orchestra director at Autrey Mill Middle School in Fulton County. Prior to this he worked in the Gwinnett County system where in 2001 he was nominated as his local school Teacher of the Year and as a top 20 finalist at the county level. He received his undergraduate education at the University of Illinois and received a masters of music education degree from the University of Georgia. Mr. Anderson is the co-director of the American String Teachers Association Summer Orchestra Camp and is active in both ASTA and GMEA activities and events. His orchestras consistently receive superior ratings at GMEA Large Group Performance Evaluation and he is active as both a clinician and judge throughout the state. In his free time Mr. Anderson is a cellist, performing locally as a freelance musician and throughout the southeast with his band *Jackson County Line*.

In addition to conducting the Autrey Mill Middle School orchestras, Mr. Anderson is also the conductor of the Fulton County Symphonic Youth Orchestra, a group consisting of some of the best 7th and 8th grade students from throughout Fulton County.
